



The Kildare countryside provides a stunning backdrop for the gardens at The K Club. The trees across the resort have long been a feature of the landscape, with the name Kildare being derived from Gaelic; Cill meaning 'Church' and Dair meaning 'Oak'. The formal gardens were originally created by the Barton's in the 19th Century and feature many unusual species of trees, all of which you can discover using this map.

After exploring the gardens, make your way to the K Trails for a relaxing stroll or leisurely cycle along the river side through the woodland using a complimentary resort bicycle. There are also lots of other activities on offer: from the serenity of fishing on the River Liffey to the thrill of horse riding through the Kildare countryside, there are a host of family friendly activities to experience.
